## Voters to Elect New Board of Education Members

The Aurora Public Schools Board of Education will have four seats open this fall. The seven-member group establishes policies for the school district. Board members are elected at large and serve four-year terms. The board addresses the concerns of the local community while working within the framework of state and federal laws. This includes approving curricula and instructional materials, evaluating the superintendent and adopting the annual budget.

Board candidates run on a non-partisan basis and do not need to be educators. The election will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 5.

### Voter Registration

- You may register to vote by appearing in-person at a voter service and polling center through Election Day.
- You may register at [govotecolorado.com](http://govotecolorado.com) through the eighth day before the election.
- You may submit an application through the mail, a voter registration agency, a local driver's license examination facility or a voter registration drive no later than 22 days before an election.

### Weather Conditions

When inclement weather hits Aurora, APS staff members assess conditions beginning just after midnight to determine the impact on operations. If there is a need to close schools or delay the start of the school day, Superintendent Rico Munn and staff will make the decision as early as possible.

### Delayed Start Times

Should APS staff make the decision to delay school, the school day would begin one hour later than normal. APS buses will pick up students one hour later than normal. Staff members are expected to arrive at school as close to their regular start time as is safely possible.
